# Steve Tellier Memorial Scholarship

The Scholarship is open to children of New Hampshire Assessors or those working within the assessing function.

To honor our friend and colleague Steve Tellier; the NHAAO, in 2007, established the Steve Tellier Memorial Scholarship. Steve's passion and enthusiasm to promote advancements in the assessing field, as well as his involvement with community youth programs will always be remembered.

Steve was an outstanding professional, dear friend and admired by the members of the New Hampshire Association of Assessing Officials (NHAAO); and in recognition of his devotion working with local youth the NHAAO established this scholarship. It is presented to exceptional high school and college students wishing to pursue a college or technical school education.

### **Award Criteria**

- ✓ A child of a parent or legal guardian of a regular, associate\*, municipal or honorary member of the New Hampshire Association of Assessing Officials (NHAAO) as described in the by-laws; all serving in good standing on April 1 of the year of application.
- ✓ Open to high school students in their senior year and college students attending a 2 or 4 year college or technical school.
- ✓ Academic achievement as indicia of future success in post-secondary education, with a minimum GPA of 2.5 or be in the top 1/3 of class. However, grades alone are not the sole determining criteria.
- Active participation in schoolsponsored, extracurricular activities and/or community service activities will be helpful.
- An essay on goals and ambitions (two page type-written maximum).
- ✓ Two letters of reference (new, not previously submitted).

## How to Apply

Applicants must submit the <u>completed</u> Steve Tellier Memorial Scholarship application by April 15th. Applications are available online or upon request starting in January.

Please **mail**, **email**, or **deliver** your application including essay, transcripts and letters of recommendation to the noted address no later than or postmarked by April 15.

#### Links to transcripts will not be accepted.

Letters of recommendation (new, not previously submitted) may be emailed, however they must be on letterhead, signed and received by the application deadline.

We are <u>not</u> responsible for undelivered emails. Emails that end up in junk/spam or otherwise are undeliverable will not be considered as a timely filing. If relying on a clearing house to send your information, it is your responsibility to make sure we receive all information by the deadline.

Grantees (or parents/legal guardian in cases of minors) are required to sign a release authorizing the NHAAO to use their essays, names, pictures and name of their school in announcements of the scholarship award; in promotion of the scholarship program, and in NHAAO program material.

Official grade transcripts through the prior December 31 <sup>st</sup> for high School or your current college transcript.	
Maximum two-page typewritten essay addressing the topic of your goals and ambitions; or if you have received a Steve Tellier scholarship, how has the scholarship helped you towards your goals.	
<ul> <li>Two letters of recommendation (new, not previously submitted), as follows:</li> <li>A teacher/professor you have had for an academic course, and</li> <li>Non-related member of your community who is familiar with your community service and character or an employer from a job that you had during school, or</li> <li>Your choice of an unrelated person</li> </ul>	
Any other statement or information you desire to present relative to your application. For example, if family or other circumstances required you to work rather than participate in community services; or if an illness caused you to miss a great deal of school one semester and that is reflected in the grades. Please label this as SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION and restrict it to one typewritten page.	

A minimum of \$500 will be awarded to the selected qualifying applicants. Winners will be notified by June 30.

Decisions made by the Scholarship Committee are final.
